Priorities for 2021-22

- Continue to use (and try to utilise more) local sports clubs and coaches to support the quality of teaching and learning. Expert coaching delivered alongside the class teacher.
- Encourage teachers to use the new PE scheme of work with help from GetSet4PE through staff CPD.
- Track and assess pupils' swimming ability to ensure we have a clear record of who can or can't swim 25m (2 lengths of our pool would be 30m).
- Provide additional swimming sessions for any child not on track to swim 25m by the summer term of Year 6.
- Maintain high level of clubs and extra-curricular activities (currently 13 sports clubs offered each week) maintain registers as a record.
- Maintain high level of participation in inter school competitions.
- Maintain and increase opportunities to link with local sports clubs and sports scholarships to secondary schools.
- Ensure there is a clear pathway to identify talent and help parents join local clubs.
- To ensure sports equipment is fit for purpose and enables the curriculum and clubs to be delivered effectively.
- Staff CPD for new sports.

£199	Hockey sticks	New hockey sticks purchased so every pupil has their own to use in PE lessons. Given us a range of sizes for taller/smaller pupils.	Meant all pupils have a hockey stick in lessons therefore can all join in. The ones that were broken were disposed off and everyone had a fair chance of playing.
£1860	Dance teacher	Specialist dance teacher for the production dances and then for PE lessons for the rest of the school.	Pupils are able to learn choreographed dances for shows as well as accessing the dance curriculum within their lessons.
£1703	Biking teacher	Year 5 and 6 have 6 weeks of lessons to ensure they can ride their bike. Year 6 also attend cycle-park to round off their learning.	Gives the pupils confidence to not only ride their bike at home but also to and from school, therefore helping the environment.
£47	PE kit	Extra PE kit bought for returning teachers from maternity leave. PE jacket bought for specialist PE teacher to be worn on PE teaching days and when out representing the school.	Pupils can see that all the teachers are suitably dressed for PE lessons. When out on school visits and representing the school staff feel part of the St John's team.
£9	Whistles	Make sure everyone has a whistle that they can use within the PE lessons.	PE can be taught properly and safely as all pupils to know to stop straight away as soon as they hear the whistle.
£625	Biking service	Bikes Service by Sevenoaks Bike Shop to ensure they are safe and fit for purpose for Year 5 and 6 pupils to use in their biking lessons.	All the bikes are served and fit fur purposes. Ensures we have enough bikes for one each when they are having their biking sessions.

£39	New trampette	Old trampette not fit for purpose so new one order in time for gymnastics being taught within school. Also used for Sensory Circuits.	Trampette can be used for jumping onto one of the tops to give the pupils a different way of travelling.
£750	Carroty Wood	Subsidy for Year 4 attending Carroty Wood.	Enables the pupils to trial new outdoor activities. Many students have their first night away from home, making beds, laying tables for dinner, washing up and cleaning.
£500	Sailing for 4 students	Sailing sessions for 4 Year 5 students to complete their Level 1 Sailing qualification.	All four students now would like to become part of the sailing group and continue to pursue their interest in a new sport.
£358	Trip to Wimbledon	8 pupils attended the Wimbledon Quarter Finals.	Pupils able to go and watch a high standard of live tennis. All pupils participate in tennis outside of school and many are now talking about wanting to play at Wimbledon in the future.
£1170	Forest school	Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 visited a Forest School in Four Elms.	Forest School purposely developed for Key Stage 1.
£228	Fuel for minibus for Forest School and other sports events	Fuel in the minibus so pupils can attend Forest School and also other sporting competitions run by Sevenoaks School and the Sevenoaks Partnership.	Enabled all pupils to attend Forest School in Key Stage 1. Meant we could enter more competitions and transport more children to events.
£283	Sports Day equipment	New javelins, tennis balls, stickers and dodgeballs.	Meant we could have more events at Sports Day, concluding Javelin, discuss, shot putt and standing long jump.

£1000	PE iPad	iPad purchased specifically for PE lessons, trips and events.	Enables pupils who cannot participate to video other pupils and discuss their technique and tactics within a match situation. iPad for the finish line on Sports Day for races. When pupils attend events of sports trips iPad goes with them so we have evidence.
£960	Biking for Years R-4	Pupils from Reception to Year 4 being taught how to ride a bike or if they can ride a bike have a session with a specialist biking expert.	Gives pupils the chance to learn to ride a bike before they get into Year 5 and 6. Lots of parents asking whether we could give them guidance as to how to teach their children to ride a bike so they were invited to attend the sessions with their children.
