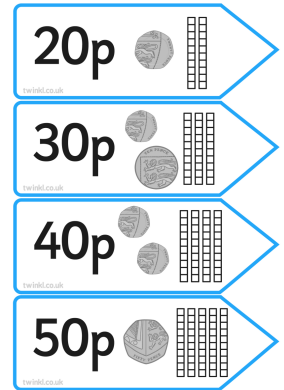


Home-learning 31st January

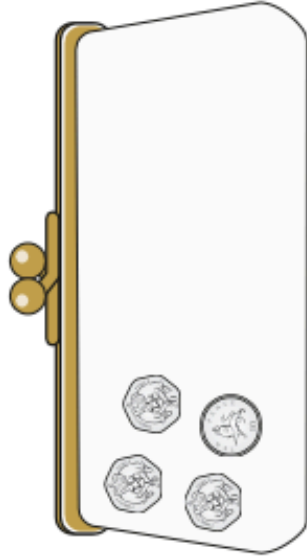

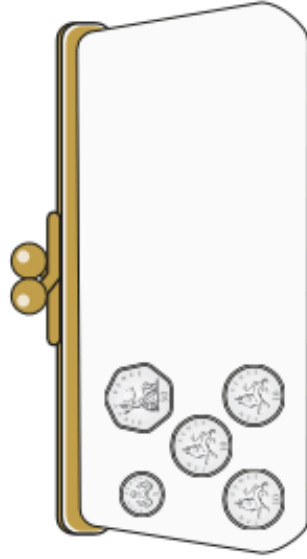

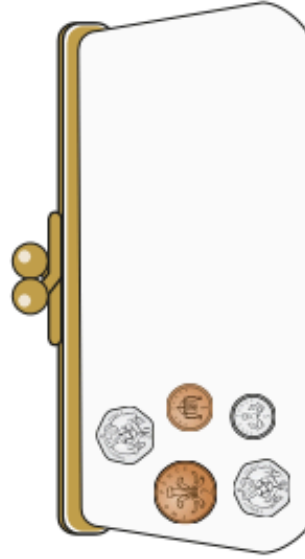

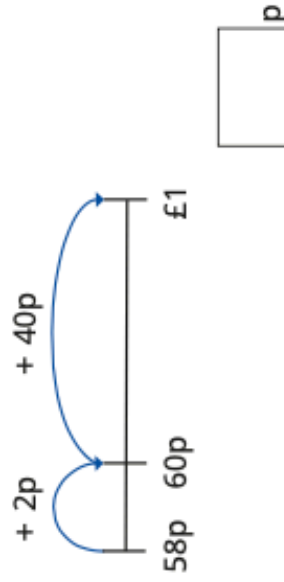
