The team ended the tournament in Bronze place, quite an accolade for such a small school! Go St Johns!


Sports update: netball

Year 4: Wally Hall Workshop

On Thursday 11th January, Owl Class attended a science workshop at Walthamstow Hall. We arrived and were told that a teacher had been "kidnapped" and set a CSI investigation to find out what could have happened to her. As excellent detectives with solid scientific skills, we set about exploring the evidence. We carried out Chromatography work to match ink samples, tested soil samples for their minerals, used evidence of what types of hot drinks teachers preferred so as to eliminate possible suspects and we used microscopes in the lab to look at hair samples found at the crime scene. The children were so enthusiastic and engaged, developing their observations skills, use of scientific equipment and recording in tables skills throughout the morning. Thank you to the Wally Hall team who so expertly took Owl Class on their CSI adventure.



FIZZ POP Science Club

Wow!!!! The first FIZZ POP Science Club went well with the children being set their first challenge: to design a marble run so that a marble lands in a particular container at the end of a track. They worked in teams, developing collaboration skills and used different equipment to achieve their challenge.

Week 2 saw the children exploring chemistry through a demonstration of liquids and how their colours change depending on whether it is an acid or an alkali.



The children went on to create their own colourful slime which they were allowed to take home (with several promises made to not get it in the carpet or in a sibling or pet's hair!). Let's hope the children managed to keep their word whilst still enjoying their slime.
